

**MINUTES OF THE EGGLESTON PARISH COUNCIL HELD ON
TUESDAY 12 MARCH 2019 AT 19:00 AT EGGLESTON VILLAGE HALL**

Item 1. Attendees: Cllr S. Gillard; Cllr R. Hutchinson; Cllr J. Donald; Cllr E Henderson (arrived 20.05); Cllr W. Greenfield (chairman); Miss R Machin (parish clerk and minute taker)

Item 2. Accepted Apologies: Cllr M. Souter – Illness; Cllr L. Oxby – holidays

Item 3. Declaration of interest: None.

Item 4. Minutes of 12 February for acceptance and signature: Minutes proposed as correct by Cllr Donald; seconded by Cllr R. Hutchinson. All in agreement. Signed by the Chairman.

Item 5. Action Points and matters arising: The action points were updated. Items to be discharged – Notice for Recreation Park Notice Board agreed. Rights of Access – decision reached to take forward as a licence.

Matters Arising – None.

Item 6. Finance:

Item 7. Planning: Moorcock Inn revised plans have been approved by DCC.

Pathways - Footpath - No 47 Eggleston Parish Roman Road. Discussion to understand what is being changed – strong objection re any closure of any roman paths and routes that parishioners walk. All in agreement and letter to be issued to DCC accordingly.

Item 8. HGV Ban Proposal: Councillors discussed merits of proposal taking into account reasoning and proposed re-routes. All agreed it didn't appear feasible for a number of reasons, including strength of bridges on any reroutes, dealing with sat nav directions, who would police permits and changing Dft route for emergency traffic. Email response to working group accordingly.

Item 9. Right of Access/Pinfold: Rights of Access - Debate amongst councillors considering the merits of a licence for rights of access versus an Easement, with pros and cons of both being weighed. Majority decision was for take forward as Licence. All rights of access regarding village green will be considered in due course. Wayleaves – per utilities is legal and will remain unchanged. Pinfold – cost of stone will be about £35 per ton and 1 ton would be required per metre of wall approximately. When light gets better, councillors will examine Pinfold and consider placement/measurements for potential wall to get as close to traditional arrangements as it realistic.

Item 10. Payment of Basic Allowances etc.: No change in how Eggleston Council operates – no allowances at all for any councillors other than travel and subsistence when necessary.

Item 11. Feedback from Meetings: Cllr W. Greenfield attended smaller councils meeting. Steve Ragg is appointing member to job share with him so he can pass on his experience before he retires. Information discussed in terms of Risk Assessments that all councils should complete – for which training is being considered.
